'NZME' means all companies in the NZME Group including but not limited to APN Holdings NZ Limited, NZME. Publishing Limited, NZME. Radio Limited, GrabOne Limited and all brands and operating companies controlled by or associated with those entities.

The Promoter is NZME and the NZ Bomb Comp

Information

- The maximum capacity for the Event (both on the lake and viewing from the beach) is 7,000 people. The Promoter reserves the right to close the venue at any time, including where there are any safety or security concerns.
- Attendance at the event is at the attendees own risk. This includes his or her entry into the designated floating zone.
- The Promoter is not responsible for the actions of any event attendee.
- The Promoter reserves the right to remove people from the event if deemed intoxicated, or a risk to themselves or others.

- The Promoter can make changes to the event at any time, including to the time, duration and maximum capacity.
- In the event that weather or other unforeseen circumstances affect the safety of attendees, the Promoter reserves the right to cancel the event.
- This event is alcohol free. The Promoter and associated partners do not encourage the consumption of alcohol within or around the event.
- Upon entry, the Promoter will scan your e-ticket. The promoter will then provide a wristband to each attendee that have purchased a ticket from the GrabOne website. The wristband will allow attendees to leave and return to the event but re-entry is not guaranteed and the Promoter reserves the right to deny entry in its sole discretion, including if the Promoter and associated partners believe an attendee is intoxicated or a risk to themselves or others.
- The Promoter will be controlling crowd entry and movement – this is at the sole discretion of the Promoter, The NZ Bomb Comp and partners.
- At the event you will be able to jump off the NZ Bomb Comp tower at no charge.

Vendors

- 1) Vendors will be dealing mainly with EFTPOS and all ticketholders should expect cashless vendors;
- 2) Only small transactions will be taking place;
- 3) Access to areas with cash will be highly restricted.

Consumption of Drugs and Alcohol

- 1) No alcohol will permitted onsite;
 - 2) The Promoter and Security shall monitor the public on site, **so far as is reasonably practicable** (Sfairp), and will take appropriate action should a member of the public found to be under the influence of alcohol. Intoxicated persons may be escorted from the event at the discretion of the Promoter and/or security, and not permitted reentry;
 - 3) Only prescription medication is permitted onsite at any time. Members of the public who are, at the discretion of the Promoter and/or security, found or likely to be under either the influence of illegal drugs or substances will be escorted from site and not permitted reentry. The Promoter and/or security may contact the Police;
- All persons attending the event should expect bags to be searched by Security upon arrival. The Promoter will allow small personal items through gates excluding beverages. These are to be carried by the patron and will be taken into the event at their own risk.

- 4) Workers and Contractors taking prescribed medication must provide evidence that they are fit for work and not a liability to themselves or other members of staff;
- 5) There are no plans to either give away or sell alcohol during the period of this event.

Evacuation Procedures

- 1) In the event of an emergency security and event staff will steer you towards the nearest exit. The meeting points will be located at the top of Tarawera Road and bottom of Tarawera road near the holiday park.

First Aid Facilities

- 1) Two trained Medics will be available during the duration of the Event. First Aid facilities will be provided onsite.
- 2) The Promoter 'NZME' will have the contact details of local emergency services on hand.

Vehicles and Pedestrian

- 1) A traffic management plan will be in place prior to event commencing;
- 2) Contractors and Promoter to monitor the capabilities of the drivers permitted onsite;
- 3) Organisers will arrange the outside traffic routes and parking. Access into the Event will be controlled and Traffic Marshalls will direct vehicles to parks where applicable. A one-way system will be used where possible;
- 4) There is a speed restriction of 5kph on the site;
- 5) The public's vehicles will be parked in a separate area away from the event so as not to obscure or create risk to participants;
- 6) Emergency Services access will be left clear at all times.

Swimming/ Use of Floatation Devices

- 1) Floatation devices will be strictly limited to those aged 16yrs+;
- 2) The Promoter will provide a maximum of 600 floaties to be given away (at the event) at the Promoter's discretion and to selected attendees with proof they are aged 16+ and who are competent swimmers. All other attendees of the designated floating zone must provide their own floatation devices.
- 3) Attendees must use floatation devices responsibly. Floatation devices will not be replaced if damaged or do not inflate.
- 4) The Promoter and associated partners will create a 'swimming zone' for attendees to occupy on the lake; this area will be contained and clearly marked. No one is guaranteed a place within the designated floating zone. All attendees not within the designated floating zone will be invited to sit on the beach or reserve to view the event.
- 5) There will be ongoing monitoring of the number of swimmers in the designated area;
- 6) Event will be terminated in the event of unfavourable weather conditions or a civil emergency
- 7) A large team of competent lifeguards and water safety crew will be on hand to ensure water assistance is provided at all times to anyone in need. They will be stationed across the bomb tower and beach. The swimming area will be cordoned off so that lifeguards can easily monitor those within the designated area, and to restrict any vessels from entering swimming areas;
- 8) The maximum capacity of the designated floating zone is 1,000 attendees. Of the 7,000 people attending, only 1,000 may occupy this area.
- 9) During the NZ Bomb competition, competent swimmers will be monitoring the event at height using the bombing platform to ensure constant visuals of members of the public swimming for the duration of the event;
- 10) An alert system will be agreed upon prior to the event which will be used should a member of the public need assistance.

Boats

1. Boats must be 30 foot or under.
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2. Your boat must be a proper vessel. No makeshift boats will be given access to the water.
3. Skippers must arrive at the lake prior to or at 8am. Traffic management will be on site to direct you as to where you may moor your vessel. Boat parking will be sign posted, and traffic management will direct you to where you can park your vehicle.
4. All vessels must be in the water by 11am. Vessels will be unable to enter the lake after 11am. In the event of arrival after 11am, the Boat Admission will be void and the skipper will receive a GA ticket to allow them to attend the festival in the general admission area.
5. In purchasing a Boat Admission ticket you consent to two security guards boarding your vessel to search it for drugs and alcohol.
6. In the event that drugs and alcohol are found on your vessel, the Skipper and vessel will be denied entry to the festival. Admission of all other passengers in the general admission area will be at the discretion of the Promoter.
7. If you resist security's decision in respect of the above, the Promoter retains the right to call the police.
8. There is a 5 knot speed limit across the entire lake which must be adhered to.
9. All vessels must have sufficient life jackets for all passengers.
10. It is recommended that you use a bimmy (shade cover).
11. From 12pm – 6pm your boat will need to be moored and not moving around the water.
12. There is to be no music played from your boat from 12pm – 6pm. If a water patrol officer asks you to turn off your music and you do not comply, you will be escorted off the water with your boat.
13. If you are on your vessel and need to get back to shore, your boat must remain correctly moored. Your ticketing pack will include a flag which you can use to attract the attention of a water safety officer, who will pick you up.
14. You must enter the water before 11am and you will not be able to leave the water with your boat until it is deemed safe to leave by the event health and safety staff.

NZME Responsibility

1. NZME reserves the right to amend, vary, extend or discontinue a Promotion at any stage, for any reason.
2. NZME takes no responsibility for any inability to enter, complete, continue or conclude the Promotion due to equipment or technical malfunction, busy lines, inadvertent disconnection, texts with a misspelt keyword, texts to an incorrect shortcode, Force Majeure or otherwise.

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 - This event is alcohol free. The Promoter and associated partners do not encourage the consumption of alcohol within or around the event.
 - The Promoter will allow small personal items through gates excluding beverages. These are to be carried by the patron and will be taken into the event at their own risk.
 - The Promoter will be random bag checks on entry.
